

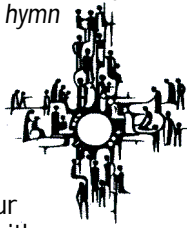

Sermon

The Affirmation of Faith

Let us affirm our faith in Jesus Christ the Son of God

All

Though he was divine,
he did not cling to equality with God,
but made himself nothing.
Taking the form of a slave,
he was born in human likeness.
He humbled himself and was obedient to death, even the death of the cross.
Therefore God has raised him on high, and given him the name above every name: that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, and every voice proclaim that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

The prayer continues and includes one of the following acclamations

Breaking of the Bread

The President breaks the consecrated bread, saying

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

All **Though we are many, we are one body,
because we all share in one bread.**

Giving of Communion and Laying on of Hands

*The president and people receive communion. You are encouraged
to come forward straight away to receive communion or a
blessing (following the choir if there is one!)*

*The LAYING ON OF HANDS with prayer for HEALING will be
offered to any who seek it during the time of communion. Please
bring the card you have been given to indicate this. A set form of
words will be used.*

*A more specific and personal Prayer Ministry will be offered, in
complete confidence, by two Prayer Ministers in the North Aisle.*

Before the distribution the president says

All **God's holy gifts for God's holy people
Jesus Christ is holy,
Jesus Christ is Lord,
to the glory of God the Father.**

*The president and people receive communion. 6
During the distribution hymns and anthems may be sung.*

Prayer after Communion *(one of these is used)*

*God of all mercy,
in this eucharist you have
set aside our sins
and given us your healing:
grant that we who are
made whole in Christ
may bring that healing
to this broken world,
in the name of Jesus
Christ our Lord.
Amen.*

*Eternal God,
comfort of the afflicted
and healer of the broken,
you have fed us at the
table of life and hope:
teach us the ways of
gentleness and peace,
that all the world may
acknowledge the
kingdom of your Son,
Jesus Christ our Lord.
Amen*

Please stand for the Final Hymn

Acclamation

come, Lord Jesus.**
All **With judgement and mercy,
come, Lord Jesus.**
All **In power and glory,
come, Lord Jesus.**
All **In wisdom and truth,
