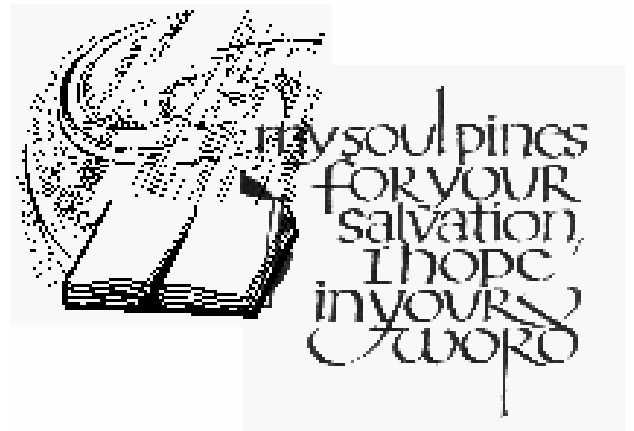

and of your own do we give you.**

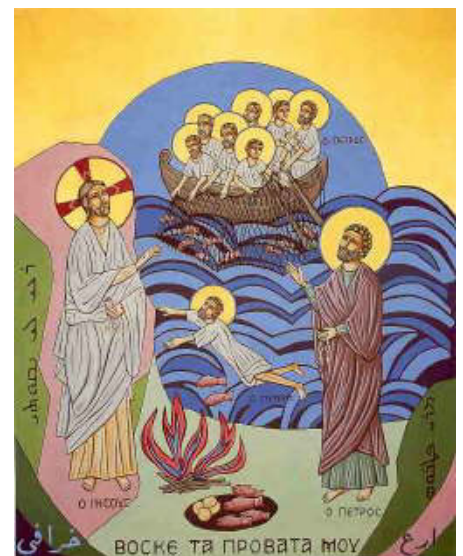
Re-dedication
